The following observations are submitted on behalf of Crewe Town Council Planning Committee relating to planning application 22/1419N:

1. That the existing boundary hedges and trees should be retained and maintained and not adversely affected by any proposed development. This will fulfil local planning policy associated with sustainability and biodiversity protection, as well as retaining positive features of the street scene.
2. That such enforceable conditions are included in any associated planning consent to ensure that the development does not adversely impact on the amenity of neighbouring property due to noise or operation (such as deliveries) during anti-social hours
3. That the proposals are redrawn to regularise the planning position for external features not currently included, such as extraction/refrigeration, external lighting, signage and roller shutter doors
4. That the proposals should be resubmitted to include for the treatment of the existing garage, which is not shown on the proposals
5. That consideration to highways restrictions should be given in relation to reducing parking on the corners close to the premises
6. That the amenity of neighbouring residents should be considered in all issues relating to the operation of the premises
7. That there should be no detrimental effect on the street scene , for example due to stark nature of the elevations or the shutter door feature.
8. That the waste storage area is defined away from the adjoining residential boundary to reduce the risk of loss of amenity to the neighbouring residence

The Cheshire East Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 1, 2, 4, 32, 35, 38, 45, 46, 49, 51, 53, 61, 122 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the 1984 Act") and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act and as a consequence of the coming into force of Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 (hereinafter referred to as "the 2004 Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

PART I

CITATION AND INTERPRETATION

1) This Order shall come into operation on XXXXX and may be cited as the Cheshire East Borough Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Street Parking Places) (Various Roads) (Consolidation) Order 2022.

2) In this Order-

"The 1984 Act" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

"The 2004 Act" means the Traffic Management Act 2004;

"The 2022 Regulations" means The Civil Enforcement of Road Traffic Contraventions (Approved Devices, Charging Guidelines and General Provisions) (England) Regulations 2022;

"The 2016 Regulations" means the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016;

"Agent" means any person or company appointed by the Enforcement Authority for the purpose of collecting payments due under a Penalty Charge Notice;

"Ambulance" has the same meaning as in Schedule 2 of the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act (VERA) 1994;

"Business" means a Business whose registered office or main place of Business is at premises the postal address of which is specified in Schedule 5 to this Order;

"Business Permit" means a Permit or Virtual Permit issued by the Council to a Business;

"Carer" means a person who attends the domestic property of a Resident for the purpose of providing medical or social care to the Resident;

"Carers Permit" means a Permit or Virtual Permit issued by the Council to a Resident for use by a Carer;

"Carriageway" has the same meaning as in the Highways Act 1980;

"Civil Enforcement Officer" means a person employed in accordance with section 76 of the 2004 Act to enforce the prohibitions, restrictions and regulations imposed by this Order;

"Coach", "Coaches" has the same meaning as bus in Schedule 1 of the 2016 Regulations;

"Coach Only Parking Place" means a Parking Place which is restricted to Coaches and specified on the Plan as 'Coach Only Parking Place';

"Controlled Parking Zone" or "Controlled Zone" has the same meaning as Controlled Parking Zone in Part 2, Schedule 1 of the 2016 Regulations;

"Cycle track" has the same meaning as in the Highways Act 1980;

"Disabled Person" and "Disabled Person's Badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles)(England) Regulations 2000;

"Disabled Persons' Parking Place" means each part of the roads specified on the Map Schedules as a Disabled Persons' Parking Place and which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 6 of Schedule 7, Part 4 to the 2016 Regulations;

"Disabled Person's Vehicle" means a Vehicle lawfully displaying in the Relevant Position a Disabled Person's Badge and is a Vehicle which, immediately before or after any period of waiting allowed by virtue of this Order, has been or is about to be driven by a disabled person or, as the case may be, has been or is about to be used for carrying disabled persons as passengers.

"Driver" in relation to waiting in a Prohibited Road, Restricted Road, No Stopping Road or a Parking Place, means the person driving the Vehicle at the time it was left in the Prohibited Road, Restricted Road, No Stopping Road or Parking Place;

"Electric Vehicle" means a motor Vehicle which is propelled by electric energy (battery-only powered Vehicle) from rechargeable batteries. The batteries provide the power to propel the Vehicle and to power the lights and all accessories within the Vehicle. Hybrid Vehicles which require charging are included in this category;

"Electric Vehicle Charging Place" means a Parking Place designated for the sole use by an electric Vehicle for continuous charging time, subject to any maximum period of stay;

"Electric Vehicle Charging Point" means a purpose-built unit designed specifically for electric Vehicle charging;

"Enactment" means any enactment, whether public, general or local, and includes any order, byelaw rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

"Enforcement Authority" has the same meaning as in Schedule 8 to the 2004 Act;

"Footway" has the same meaning as in the Highways Act 1980;

"Goods" means Goods of any kind whether animate or inanimate and "Delivering" and "Collecting" in relation to any Goods or postal packets includes checking the Goods or postal packets for the purpose of their delivery or collection;

"Goods Vehicle" has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 of the 2016 Regulations;

"Limited Waiting Parking Place" means a Parking Place designated by this Order for waiting during the Permitted Hours and Days as specified on the Map Schedule;

"Loading and Unloading" means the transference of Goods from (or to) a Vehicle to (or from) premises situated adjacent to or in the near vicinity of the Loading Bay;

"Loading Bay" means an area of a highway designated by this Order for the Loading and Unloading of Vehicles and specified on the Map Schedule;

"Map Schedule" means the Map Tiles attached to this Order and listed in Schedule 2, which depict the stopping, waiting and loading prohibitions and restrictions and Parking Places, loading places and parking areas designated by this Order, and in conjunction with the Map Tile Label and/or Map Schedule Legend, identifies the type of each particular type of prohibition, restriction, Parking Place, loading place or parking area and certain of its governing provisions:

PROVIDED that the Council does not accept responsibility for inaccuracies contained in the Ordnance Survey data relied upon to create the Map Schedule and where a prohibition, restriction, Parking Place, loading place or parking area is depicted on the Map Schedule, that provision continues to apply irrespective of any subsequent changes that have been made to the underlying Ordnance Survey data.

"Map Schedule Legend" means the Map Schedule Legend to this Order which, when used in conjunction with a Map Tile as listed in Schedule 2, identifies the specific types of prohibitions and restrictions of stopping, waiting and loading and the Parking Places, loading places or parking areas designated by this Order and, where appropriate, certain of their governing provisions.

"Map Tile" means an individual map with a specific tile reference, being part of the Map Schedule as listed in Schedule 2 to this Order.

"Map Tile Label" where shown on a Map Tile forming part of the Map Schedule in relation to a prohibition or restriction of stopping, waiting or loading, or a designated Parking Place, loading place or parking area, means a label which indicates the type of provision and, if appropriate, certain of its governing conditions.

"Motorcycle" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the 1984 Act;

“No Stopping Road” means any of the sides or lengths of roads (including clearways) as specified in the Map Schedule where stopping is prohibited or restricted provided that the expression “No Stopping Road” shall not include any Parking Place;

"Owner" in relation to a Vehicle includes any person who, by virtue of The 2022 Regulations, falls to be treated as the Owner of the Vehicle;

"Parking Disc" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 which is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of parking has begun;

“Parking Place” means an area of a highway designated by this Order and shown on the Map Schedules for the waiting of Vehicles;

“Passenger Vehicle” means a motor Vehicle (other than a Motorcycle) constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of not more than twelve passengers (exclusive of the Driver) and their effects and not drawing a trailer;

"Pedestrian Zone" has the same meaning as in Part 2, Schedule 1 of the 2016 Regulations;

"Penalty Charge" means a charge payable in accordance with The 2022 Regulations and is a charge set by the Council in accordance with The 2022 Regulations;

"Penalty Charge Notice" has the same meaning as in The 2022 Regulations;

“Permit” means any valid current Permit or Virtual Permit being a Residents Permit, Business Permit, Carers Permit or Visitors Permit issued under the provisions of this Order by the Council to allow the authorised use of a Permit Parking Place or Permit Parking Area;

"Permit Charge" means the charge payable on application to the Council or their Agent for a Permit or Virtual Permit as specified in Schedule 4;

“Permit Holder” means a person to whom a Permit or Virtual Permit has been issued under the provisions of this Order;

“Permit Parking Area” (also expressed in this Order as "area") has the same meaning as in the 2016 Regulations;

“Permit Parking Place” means a road or any length of road as specified in the Map Schedule, which is provided by the Council for the leaving of a Vehicle under the provisions of this Order, and is indicated by the prescribed Traffic Signs;

"Permitted Hours and Days", means the days and hours during which a Vehicle of a specific class is Permitted to wait in a Parking Place, Parking Area, or Load, or Unload a Vehicle in a Loading Bay, whilst complying with the relevant provisions of this Order and that are as specified on a

Traffic Sign in the vicinity of that Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay, and are as specified in the Map Schedule;

"Prohibited Hours", in relation to :

- a) any Prohibited Road, Pedestrian Zone, Controlled Parking Zone or Restricted Parking Zone, being the hours during which a Vehicle may not wait whilst complying with the relevant provisions of this Order, means the hours shown by or on a Traffic Sign in the vicinity of or at the entrance to such parking controls and the hours as specified in the Map Schedule in relation to such controls;
- b) a School Keep Clear Entrance Marking, means the time indicated on a Traffic Sign placed in the vicinity of that School Keep Clear Entrance Marking and as specified in the Map Schedule, in relation to that School Keep Clear Entrance Marking;
- c) a Taxi Stand, Ambulance bay or Coach bay means the time indicated on a Traffic Sign placed in the vicinity of that Taxi Stand, Ambulance bay or Coach bay and as specified in the Map Schedule, in relation to that Taxi Stand, Ambulance Bay or Coach Bay, as the case may be;

"Prohibited Road" means any of the sides or lengths of roads specified on the Map Schedules as having a prohibition of Waiting, or a prohibition of Waiting and Loading, during the Prohibited Hours, provided that the expression "Prohibited Road" shall not include any Parking Place or Parking Area;

"Relevant Position" in respect of: -

- a) a Disabled Person's Badge has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles)(England) Regulations 2000; and
- b) a disabled person's Parking Disc, has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2020;
- c) a Permit or Waiver Certificate must be displayed continuously on the windscreen, on the nearside of the windscreen, or nearside of the dashboard of the Vehicle so that it is facing upwards and all particulars are visible and can be read from outside of the front or nearside of the Vehicle, or in respect of which there has been granted a valid Virtual Permit which exempts them from displaying a Permit.

"Resident" means a person whose usual place of abode is at a domestic property the postal address of which is specified in Schedule 5 to this Order;

"Resident Permit" means a Permit or Virtual Permit issued by the Council to a Resident;

"Restricted Hours and Days" means in relation to any Restricted Road the hours and days during which waiting is restricted as specified on the Map Schedules;

"Restricted Road" means any of the sides or lengths of roads specified on the Map Schedules as having a restriction of Waiting, or a Waiting and Loading restriction, during the Restricted Hours

and Days so specified, provided that the expression "Restricted Road" shall not include any Parking Place;

"Restricted Parking Zone" has the same meaning as in Part 2, Schedule 1 of the 2016 Regulations;

"School Keep Clear Entrance Marking" means a marking outside a school entrance and specified on the Map Schedules where Vehicles must not stop, which is marked on the carriageway as prescribed by diagram 1027.1 in the 2016 Regulations;

"Specified Class of Vehicle" means a Vehicle satisfying all of the criteria listed in Article 68;

"Taxi" means a hackney carriage as defined under section 38 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 which is –

- a) Licensed by the Council; and
- b) Attended by the Driver and available for hire.

"Taxi Stand" or "Taxi Rank" means an area of Carriageway comprised within and indicated by road markings complying with diagram 5 in Schedule 7, Part 4 to the 2016 Regulations, reserved for use by Taxis waiting to pick up passengers;

"Universal Service Provider", "Provision of a Universal Postal Service" and "Postal Packet" shall bear the same meanings as in the Postal Services Act 2000;

"Valid Permit" means any Permit or Virtual Permit issued under the provisions of this Order and identified as such under column 2 of Schedule 6 to this Order that is required to be displayed in a Vehicle, unless the Permit Holder has been granted a Valid Virtual Permit which exempts them from displaying a Permit, left in any Parking Place or Parking Area identified under column 1 of that Schedule where that parking Permit complies with the provisions of this Order, the conditions stated in column 3 of that Schedule and the Council's terms and conditions for the issue and operation of parking Permits;

"Vehicle" means any motorcar, Motorcycle or other mechanically propelled automobile;

"Verge" means any part of a road which is not a carriageway, Footway or Cycle track;

"Virtual Permit" means an electronic record of a Permit or waiver issued and confirmed by the Council to exempt a Vehicle from a restriction under the terms and charges applicable at the time of issue;

"Visitor" means any person who is visiting a Resident;

"Visitors Permit" means a scratch card or Virtual Permit issued by the Council to a Resident for use by Visitors;

“Waiver Certificate” means a certificate issued by the Council Permitting a named Vehicle to wait in specified circumstances on a length or lengths of road where the waiting of that Vehicle would otherwise be prohibited or restricted or a Permit would otherwise be required;

"Zone" means the streets and parts of streets containing Permit Parking Places as specified in the Map Schedule, where the Zone Identifier for such Parking Places indicates the Zone to which those Parking Places belong, and the relevant details and conditions, as set out in Schedule 3, and the eligibility of Residents to obtain Parking Permits for use in that Zone and no other as set out in Schedule 5.

“Zone Identifier” means any symbol, logo, letter, numeral or name (or any combination of such), specified in column 1 of Schedule 3 applicable to the Permit Parking Places or areas specified in column 2 and named in column 3 of that Schedule and used on Permits to identify the Permit Parking Places or areas for which they are valid and on signs at Relevant Parking Places or areas and as specified in the Map Schedule to indicate the Permits valid for those relevant Parking Places or areas

- 3) In this Order, except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule shall be construed as a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order and any reference to the Map Schedule is a reference to a Map Tiles and Map Schedule Legend incorporated into this Order as the Map Schedule.
- 4) Any reference in this Order to any Enactment shall be construed as a reference to that Enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent Enactment.
- 5) The prohibitions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any Regulations or Orders made or having effect as if made under the The 1984 Act, or by or under any other enactment.
- 6) Unless the context otherwise requires words denoting the singular shall include the plural and vice versa and words denoting the persons shall include either gender, bodies corporate, unincorporated associations and partnerships.
- 7) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if for the purposes of Section 21 of that Act this Order were an Act of Parliament and the Orders revoked by Schedule 1 were Acts of Parliament thereby repealed.

PART II
PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING, PROHIBITION OF LOADING
AND UNLOADING

PROHIBITION OF WAITING

- 8) Save as provided in Articles 12 to 17 to this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer or a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any Vehicle or any class of Vehicle to wait at any time in any Prohibited Road as specified in the Map Schedule, when a prohibition on Waiting or Waiting on a Verge or Footway is in effect.

RESTRICTION OF WAITING

- 9) Save as provided in Articles 12 to 17 to this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer or a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any Vehicle or any class of Vehicle to wait in any Restricted Road during the Restricted Hours and Days as specified in the Map Schedule, when a restriction on Waiting or Waiting on a Verge or Footway is in effect.

RESTRICTION OF LOADING OR UNLOADING

- 10) Save as provided in Articles 15 to 17, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer or a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait for the purpose of enabling Goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from a Vehicle on the sides and lengths of a No Loading Restriction during the Prohibited or Restricted Hours as specified on the Map Schedules.

PROHIBITION OF STOPPING

- 11) Save as provided in Article 17(a) to 17(f), no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any Vehicle to stop on the sides and lengths of a No Stopping Restriction or Road during the Prohibited or Restricted Hours as specified on the Map Schedules.

WAITING BY DISABLED PERSONS

- 12) Nothing in Articles 8 and 9 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle which lawfully displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Person's Badge and a Parking Disc, on which the Driver or other person in charge of the Vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began, to wait in any of the roads, lengths of road or on any of the sides of road referred to in those Articles for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same Vehicle in the same length of road or on the same side of road on the same day).

LOADING AND UNLOADING

- 13) Nothing in Articles 8 and 9 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle to Wait in any of the roads, lengths of roads, on the sides of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable Goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the Vehicle in the said lengths or road or sides of road.

BOARD AND ALIGHT FROM A VEHICLE

- 14) Nothing in Articles 8 and 9 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle to Wait in roads, lengths of road or on the sides of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the Vehicle.

FUNERALS

- 15) Nothing in Articles 8, 9 and 10 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle to Wait, if it cannot safely and conveniently do so elsewhere, at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths or sides of road for so long as may be necessary in connection with any funeral.

TAKE IN PETROL, OIL, WATER OR AIR

- 16) Nothing in Articles 8, 9 and 10 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle to Wait to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths or sides of road.

GENERAL EXEMPTIONS

- 17) Nothing in Articles 8 to 11 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle to wait in any of the roads, lengths of road or on the sides of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:
- a) the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:
 - i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths or sides of road; and
 - iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any line of telecommunication apparatus (as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984) kept installed for the purpose of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position;
 - b) the Vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority, water undertaker, sewerage undertaker or the Environment Agency in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - c) a marked Vehicle, whilst used by a Universal Service Provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, to deliver and/or collect postal packets;
 - d) a marked vehicle to be used by the fire brigade, ambulance service or police in the course of their dealing with an emergency;
 - e) the Vehicle, being a Taxi, to wait upon a Taxi Stand;
 - f) a Vehicle waiting when the person in control of it is required by law to stop; is obliged to do so in order to avoid an accident; or is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control;
 - g) so as to prevent a Vehicle waiting while any gate or other barrier at the entrance to premises on or adjacent to the said length or road to which the Vehicle is proceeding or

from which it has emerged is opened or closed, if it is not reasonably practicable for the Vehicle to wait elsewhere.

PART III
PERMITTED PARKING PLACES

DESIGNATION OF PARKING PLACES

- 18) The parts of roads as specified in the Map Schedule as Parking Places or Parking Areas and marked out and signed for the use therein of specified classes of Vehicles are hereby designated to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order as Parking Places or Parking Areas on such days and during such hours and subject to any other provisions governing their use as specified in the Map Schedule.
- 19) Unless otherwise so identified, a Designated Parking Place shall be bounded on one side of its length by the edge of the Carriageway and be an area marked out to a road marking and/or depicted by a Traffic Sign, either in accordance with the 2016 Regulations or, if applicable, by virtue of any special authorisation given by the Department of Transport.

LIMITED WAITING

- 20) Each Limited Waiting Parking Place is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a Parking Place for limited waiting by Vehicles during the Permitted Hours and Days in such positions and for such period as stated on the Map Schedule.
- 21) Save as provided in Article 94 to this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer or a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads and sides of roads referred to in Article 20-
- a) in respect of which there is specified on the Map Schedules a period in which waiting is allowed, for a period longer than that specified on the Map Schedules; or
 - b) If a period less than that specified on the Map Schedules, as being the period in which the Vehicle shall not return, has elapsed since a previous period of waiting by the same Vehicle on the same length of road.
- 22) Nothing in Article 21 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle which lawfully displays in the Relevant Positions
- a) A Disabled Person's Badge; or
 - b) A Permit

To wait, without limitation on time, on the lengths of road and sides of roads referred to in that Article.

DISABLED PERSON'S PARKING PLACE

- 23) Each of the parts of roads specified on the Map Schedules as a Disabled Person's Parking Place is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a Parking Place for a Disabled Person's Vehicle to wait during the Permitted Hours and Days in such positions and for such period as stated on the Map Schedule.

24) Save as provided in Article 94 to this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer or a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait in a Disabled Person's Parking Place at any time unless it is a Disabled Person's Vehicle which lawfully displays a Disabled Person's Badge and is in a position other than wholly within the limits of the disabled persons' parking bay.

TAXI STANDS

25) Each of the parts of roads specified on the Map Schedules as a Taxi Stand is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a Parking Place for a Taxis to wait during the Permitted Hours and Days in such positions and for such period as stated on the Map Schedule.

26) Save as provided in Article 94, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any Vehicle, other than a Taxi, to wait in a Taxi Stand during the period of operation specified on the Map Schedules.

27) No person shall cause or permit any Taxi to wait on a Taxi Stand other than for the purpose of plying for hire.

28) No person shall cause or permit any Taxi to wait in a Taxi Stand outside the period of operation specified on the Map Schedules.

GOODS VEHICLE LOADING ONLY

29) Each Loading Bay is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a Parking Place for Goods Vehicles to wait for the purpose of Loading and Unloading at all times and on all days.

30) Save as provided in Article 94 to this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer or a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait in a Loading Bay during the Permitted Hours and Days -

- a) Unless Loading and Unloading of Goods is continuously taking place from the said Vehicle.
- b) In respect of which is specified on the Map Schedule a maximum period in which limited waiting is allowed, for a period longer than that specified on the Map Schedule; or
- c) in respect of which there is specified on the Map Schedule a period in which Vehicles shall not return, if a period less than that specified on the Map Schedule has elapsed since a previous period of waiting by the same Vehicle on the same length of road.

FOR the avoidance of doubt it is hereby stated by the Council that the provisions of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 shall not apply to Articles 29 and 30 of this Order

COACH ONLY PARKING PLACE

- 31) Each Coach Only Parking Place is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a Parking Place for Coaches to wait during the Permitted Hours and Days in such positions and for such period as stated on the Map Schedule.
- 32) Save as provided in Article 94 to this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer or a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait in a Coach Only Parking Place.
- a) In respect of which is specified on the Map Schedule a maximum period in which limited waiting is allowed, for a period longer than that specified on the Map Schedule; or
 - b) in respect of which there is specified on the Map Schedule a period in which Vehicles shall not return, if a period less than that specified on the Map Schedule has elapsed since a previous period of waiting by the same Vehicle on the same length of road.

FOR the avoidance of doubt it is hereby stated by the Council that the provisions of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 shall not apply to Articles 31 and 32 of this Order

AMBULANCE ONLY PARKING PLACE

- 33) Each Ambulance Only Parking Place that is marked and/or signed for the use therein of such as are Ambulances, is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a Parking Place for Ambulances to wait during the Permitted Hours and Days in such positions and for such period as stated on the Map Schedule.
- 34) Save as provided in Article 94 to this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer or a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait in a Ambulances Only Parking Place at any time unless it is an Ambulance.
- a) In respect of which is specified on the Map Schedule a maximum period in which limited waiting is allowed, for a period longer than that specified on the Map Schedule; or
 - b) in respect of which there is specified on the Map Schedule a period in which Vehicles shall not return, if a period less than that specified on the Map Schedule has elapsed since a previous period of waiting by the same Vehicle on the same length of road.

FOR the avoidance of doubt it is hereby stated by the Council that the provisions of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 shall not apply to Articles 33 and 34 of this Order

MOTORCYCLE PARKING PLACE

- 35) Each Motorcycle Parking Place that is marked and/or signed for the use therein of such as are Motorcycles, is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a Parking Place for Motorcycles to wait during the Permitted Hours and Days in such positions and for such period as stated on the Map Schedule.

36) Save as provided in Article 94 to this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer or a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait in a Motorcycle Parking Place at any time unless it is a Motorcycle.

- c) In respect of which is specified on the Map Schedule a maximum period in which limited waiting is allowed, for a period longer than that specified on the Map Schedule; or
- d) in respect of which there is specified on the Map Schedule a period in which Vehicles shall not return, if a period less than that specified on the Map Schedule has elapsed since a previous period of waiting by the same Vehicle on the same length of road.

ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING PLACE

37) Each Electric Vehicle Charging Place is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a Parking Place for Electric Vehicles to wait during the Permitted Hours and Days in such positions and for such period as stated on the Map Schedule.

38) Save as provided in Article 94 to this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer or a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any Vehicle, that is not an Electric Vehicle parked for the purpose of charging at an Electric Vehicle Charging Point, to wait during the specified period, in any of the Electric Vehicle Charging Places identified in the Map Schedule by way of a Map Tile Label and/or the Map Schedule Legend as an Electric Vehicle Charging Place that is marked out and/or signed for the use therein of Electric Vehicles following the conditions specified in this Order in relation to that Electric Vehicle Charging Place as designated by this Order:

- a) for longer than any maximum period of continuous charging time specified in the Map Schedule; and
- b) in respect of which there is specified on the Map Schedule a period in which Vehicles shall not return, if a period less than that specified on the Map Schedule has elapsed since a previous period of waiting by the same Vehicle on the same length of road.
- c) any parking charge payable for waiting at an electric Vehicle charging bay must be paid in addition to any charge applicable to the supply of electricity.

PERMIT PARKING PLACE OR PARKING AREA

39) Each Permit Parking Place or Permit Parking Area is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order, by Permit Holders as a Parking Place or Parking Area for waiting during the Permitted Hours and Days by Vehicles of such classes, in such positions and for such period as stated on the Map Schedule.

40) Save as provided in Article 94 to this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer or a police constable in uniform, cause or permit a Vehicle to wait in a Parking Place or Parking Area referred to in Article 39 during the Permitted Hours and Days unless

- a) the Vehicle is of the Specified Class of Vehicle;

- b) the person causing or Permitting the Vehicle to wait in that Parking Place or Parking Area is a Permit Holder;
- c) the Permit relates to the Zone in which the said Vehicle is waiting
- d) the Permit is displayed in its protective cover in the Relevant Position, unless the Permit Holder has obtained a Valid Virtual Permit which exempts them from displaying a Permit; and
- e) the Permit is valid in any type of Permit Parking Place or Area as set out in Schedule 6 Column 1 where the Permit is listed as valid in Schedule 6 Column 2.
- f) the Permit is valid in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

41) Nothing in Articles 39 and 40 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle to wait in a Parking Place or Parking Area outside of the Permitted Hours and Days.

PROVISIONS RELATING TO PERMITS

Application, Issue and Display of Residents Permits

- 42) A Resident may apply for the issue of a maximum of two Residents Permits per annum for the Zone to which their property is located as shown in Schedule 5 by completing the appropriate form and submitting it to the Council together the appropriate Permit Charge as prescribed in Schedule 4 or such other fee as otherwise varied by notice.
- 43) A Residents Permit shall only be used in Vehicles waiting in the Parking Place, Parking Area or Zone specified on the Permit.
- 44) The Council may at any time before an application is processed or after a Residents Permit has been issued require the applicant or Permit Holder to produce such evidence as they may reasonable require to verify any particulars or information received by them to confirm the validity of the person applying as that of a Resident, validate the application or validate the existing Residents Permit.
- 45) Upon receipt by the Council of the correct Permit Charge, the completed application form and any other documents requested in accordance with Article 44 to this Order, the Council being satisfied that the applicant is a Resident and is the Owner of the Vehicle, or regular Driver where the Vehicle is a car registered at the DVLA to the Driver's employer, may, in its absolute discretion, issue to the applicant:-
- a) a maximum of two Permits or Virtual Permits Permitting the Permit Holder to park the Vehicle during the Permitted Hours and Days in any Zone identified on the Permit or Virtual Permit; and
 - b) one protective cover for each Permit issued, unless the Permit Holder has obtained a Valid Virtual Permit which exempts them from displaying a Permit.
- 46) A Residents Permit shall not be valid unless it is in writing, or in electronic form in respect of a Virtual Permit, and includes the following particulars:-

- a) the registration mark of the Vehicle unless the Residents Permit Holder drives a variety of company Vehicles in which case this section may have a non-specific entry;
- b) the period of time for which it is valid;
- c) an indication it has been issued by or on behalf of the Council;
- d) details of the Zone in which the Vehicle may be left; and
- e) Permit number.

Application, Issue and Display of Business Permits

- 47) Applications for Business Permits shall be made for a specified Zone as shown in Schedule 5, by a Business on the appropriate forms and submitted to the Council together the appropriate Permit Charge as prescribed in Schedule 4 or such other fee as otherwise varied by notice.
- 48) The issuing by the Council of Permits to a Business will be considered on a case by case basis in its absolute discretion.
- 49) A Business Permit issued by the Council may only be used in the Parking Place, Parking Area or Zone specified on the Permit.
- 50) The Council may at any time before an application is processed or after a Business Permit has been issued require the applicant or Permit Holder to produce such evidence as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information received by them to validate the application, the existence of the Business or the existing Business Permit.
- 51) Upon receipt by the Council of the correct Permit Charge, the completed application form and any other documents requested in accordance with Article 50 to this Order, the Council being satisfied that the application is valid and the applicant is a Business may issue to the applicant one or more Business Permits.
- 52) A Business Permit shall not be valid unless it is in writing, or in electronic form in respect of a Virtual Permit, and includes the following particulars:-
 - a) the period of time for which it is valid;
 - b) the name of the Business to whom the Permit has been issued;
 - c) an indication it has been issued by or on behalf of the Council;
 - d) details of the Zone in which the Vehicle may be left; and
 - e) Permit number.

Application, Issue and Display of Carers Permits

- 53) Applications for Carers Permits shall be made by a Resident, for the Zone to which their property is located as shown in Schedule 5, on the appropriate forms and submitted to the Council together the appropriate Permit Charge as prescribed in Schedule 4 or such other fee as otherwise varied by notice and with such evidence as the Council may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information received by them to validate the application and the Resident's need for a Carer.

- 54) The issue of Carers Permits by the Council shall be determined solely on the Council being satisfied that the applicant is a Resident and in need of a Carer and not subject to or affected by the additional holding or not of any Residents Permits.
- 55) A Carers Permit shall only be used in Vehicles waiting in the Parking Places, Parking Area or Zone specified on the Permit.
- 56) A Carers Permit shall not be valid unless it is in writing, or in electronic form in respect of a Virtual Permit, and includes the following particulars:-
- a) the period of time for which it is valid;
 - b) an indication it has been issued by or on behalf of the Council;
 - c) details of the Zone in which the Vehicle may be left; and
 - d) Permit number.

Application, Issue and Display of Visitors Permits

- 57) A Resident may apply for the issue by the Council of Permits for Visitors for the Zone in which the Resident's property is located as shown in Schedule 5 by completing the appropriate form and submitting it to the Council together the appropriate Permit Charge as prescribed in Schedule 4 or such other fee as otherwise varied by notice.
- 58) Any Resident may apply to the Council for Permits for Visitors regardless of whether they are entitled to or apply for a Residents Permit.
- 59) Visitors Permits shall be issued in the form of scratch cards or Virtual Permits, in no fewer than books of ten and Residents will be entitled to a 50% discount of the Permit Charge referred to in Article 57 on the first 40 Permits (four books of ten) issued per annum.
- 60) Each scratch card or Virtual Permit, shall clearly show:-
- a) A space where the Zone for which it will be used must be entered.
 - b) An indication it has been issued by or on behalf of the Council.
 - c) A space where the registration number of the Vehicle using the Permit must be entered.
 - d) Panels representing the day of the week, the date, the month and the year, which must be scratched off as a method of validating the Visitors Permit.
- 61) A Visitors Permit shall be displayed at all times on the nearside of the windscreen or dashboard of the Vehicle so that all particulars are visible and can be read from the front or nearside of the Vehicle at all times, unless the Permit Holder has obtained a Valid Virtual Permit which exempts them from displaying a Permit.
- 62) One or more valid Visitors Permits may be displayed simultaneously alongside each other, unless the Permit Holder has obtained a Valid Virtual Permit which exempts them from displaying a Permit.

63) A Visitors Permit shall only be valid if it is:-

- a) Displayed correctly as stated in Articles 61 and 62 to this Order;
- b) Has the registration mark of the Vehicle in which it is being used correctly entered in ink;
- c) Has the Zone in which the Permit is being used correctly entered in ink, or in electronic form in respect of a Virtual Permit;
- d) Has the correct day of the week exposed by scratching off the appropriate removable surface, or selected in respect of a Virtual Permit;
- e) Has the correct date exposed by scratching off the appropriate removable surface, or selected in respect of a Virtual Permit;
- f) Has the correct month exposed by scratching off the appropriate removable surface, or selected in respect of a Virtual Permit;
- g) Has the correct year exposed by scratching off the appropriate removable surface, or selected in respect of a Virtual Permit;
- h) Is used within the Zone(s) or road(s) for which it is valid and with the Vehicle parked in the correct manner and position in accordance with Article 79.

64) A Visitors Permit shall not be valid if:

- a) Article 63 to this Order is not fully adhered to;
- b) More than one panel in any section is scratched off or selected revealing more than one day, date, month or year; or
- c) The Visitors Permit is defaced, damaged, altered or obscured in any way as to make it unclear or any part unreadable.

65) No refund shall be payable by the Council in respect of any Visitors Permits surrendered to them.

66) The Council may at any time require an applicant or Permit Holder to produce such evidence as they reasonable require to verify any particulars or information given to them in the applicant's application form.

67) If a Resident ceases to be a Resident any Visitors Permits in the possession of that Resident shall be surrendered to the Council and shall be deemed cancelled.

Rules concerning Vehicles using Residents Permits, Business Permits, Carers Permits and Visitors Permits

68) Any Vehicles using Residents, Business, Carers or Visitors Permits must satisfy all of the following criteria:-

- a) have a gross Vehicle weight of not more than 3.5 tonnes;
- b) be a Vehicle that can carry no more than 13 people including the Driver;
- c) must not exceed 6 metres in length;
- d) must be no more than 2.44 metres (8 ft) high; and

e) be a motor Vehicle as defined by Section 136(1) of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984.

69) Permits are not required for solo Motorcycles or mopeds.

70) Trailers and caravans will not be eligible for any form of Permit but may be located in a Zone as long as they are attached to a Vehicle bearing a Valid Permit or Virtual Permit and only for as long as is reasonable to load or unload such a Vehicle. Failure to comply with this condition may render the Permit Holders Permit to be cancelled.

Surrender and withdrawal of Permits

71) A Permit Holder may voluntarily surrender their Permit to the Council at anytime. A refund for each whole month unused (less an administration fee as prescribed in Schedule 4) will be made by the Council.

72) A Permit shall remain the property of the Council at all times and is not transferable.

73) The Council may by written notice addressed to the Permit Holder and sent by recorded delivery withdraw the Permit and require the Permit Holder to surrender it to them (together with any other Permits) and within 48 hours of receiving such notice the(se) Permit(s) shall be deemed invalid.

Application and issue of replacement Permits

74) Without prejudice to the proceeding paragraphs if a Permit is accidentally mutilated, defaced or any part becomes illegible or unclear due to fading or other reasons the Permit Holder shall immediately surrender it to the Council and subject to the Permit Holder paying the Council's administration charge as prescribed in Schedule 4 or such other fee as otherwise varied by notice the Council shall issue a replacement Permit or Virtual Permit and the surrendered Permit shall be destroyed or marked as invalid.

75) Without prejudice to the proceeding paragraphs if a Permit is lost or destroyed the Permit Holder may apply to the Council for a replacement and when the Council is satisfied as to the loss or destruction and the Permit Holder has paid the appropriate Council's administration charge as prescribed in Schedule 4 or such other fee as otherwise varied by notice the Council shall issue a replacement Permit or Virtual Permit and the lost or destroyed Permit shall then become invalid.

Validity

76) Without prejudice to the proceeding paragraphs a Permit shall cease to be valid upon the expiration of the period specified in the Permit (this being the period for which payment has been made) or if the Permit has been interfered with, damaged or altered.

PART IV WAIVER CERTIFICATE

77) Nothing in Part II and Part III of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or Permitting a Vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a valid Waiver Certificate issued by the Council,

unless they have obtained a Valid Virtual Waiver Certificate which exempts them from displaying a Waiver Certificate, to wait in any Prohibited Road or in any Restricted Road or Parking Place or Parking Area, in accordance with the days, location and time period specified on the Waiver Certificate.

78) A Waiver Certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid. Notification of such cancellation shall be in writing to the holder of the Waiver Certificate at any address that the Council believes to be that person's address and the Waiver Certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council.

PART V MANNER OF STANDING

79) The Driver of a Vehicle waiting in a Parking Place or Parking Area in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order shall cause it so to stand;-

- a) i) that the left or near side of the Vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the Vehicle; and
ii) that the distance between the edge of the carriageway and the nearest wheel of the Vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres; and
- b) where carriageway markings are present so that every part of the Vehicle is within the limits of the Parking Place as so marked on the carriageway ; and
- c) that no part of the Vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the Vehicle is waiting.

Alteration of position of a Vehicle in a Parking Place

80) Without prejudice to Article 97 where any Vehicle is standing in a Parking Place or Parking Area in contravention of the provisions of Article 79 a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer or a person duly authorised by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the Vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions.

Restriction on the use of a Parking Place

81) No person shall use a Parking Place or Parking Area or any Vehicle while it is in the Parking Place or Parking Area in connection with the sale or offering or exposing for sale of any Goods to any person or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of his skill in handicraft or his services in any other capacity.

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall prevent the sale of Goods from a Vehicle if the Vehicle is one which may wait in the Loading Bay in accordance with Articles 29 and 79 and the Goods are immediately delivered at and taken into premises adjacent to the Vehicle from which the sale is affected.

82) The Driver of a Vehicle using a Parking Place or Parking Area shall stop the engine as soon as the Vehicle is in position in the Parking Place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the Vehicle in or to depart from the Parking Place or Parking Area.

- 83) If a Vehicle (or any other thing) is left in a Parking Place or Parking Area in contravention of this Order a person authorised by the Council may remove, or arrange for the removal of, the Vehicle from the Parking Place or Parking Area and shall provide for the safe custody of the Vehicle.
- 84) A police officer in uniform or Civil Enforcement Officer may move or cause to be moved or remove or cause to be removed, in case of emergency, to any place fit for purpose, any Vehicle left in a Parking Place or Parking Area and shall provide for the safe custody of the Vehicle.
- 85) Where a Vehicle (or any other thing) has been removed from a Parking Place or Parking Area in accordance with this Order, the Driver, or Owner of the Vehicle (or any other thing) or person authorised by the Owner in writing in that behalf shall be required to pay the Council up to the maximum sum set out in the relevant legislation applicable at that time and furnish satisfactory proof of identity.
- 86) Following payment of the sum mentioned in Article 85 and upon production of satisfactory proof of identity the Council shall issue a receipt, together with details of the place where the Vehicle (or any other thing) has been impounded.
- 87) Upon production of the receipt given in accordance with Article 86 to an authorised person at the place of impound the Vehicle (or other thing) shall be released to the person producing the receipt.
- 88) Any Vehicle (or any other thing) removed from the Parking Place or Parking Area in accordance with this Order, which appears to the Council to be abandoned shall be disposed of in accordance with the provisions of the Refuse Disposal (Amenity) Act 1978 and its related Regulations.
- 89) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a Parking Place or Parking Area or any part thereof whenever they consider such suspension reasonably necessary:
- a) For the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
 - b) For the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation adjacent to the Parking Place, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to the Parking Place, the laying erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to the Parking Place or any sewer or of any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication system or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign;
 - c) For the convenience or occupiers of premises adjacent to the Parking Place or Parking Area on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the Parking Place from or to a depositary, another office or dwelling-house;

- d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
 - e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the Parking Place or Parking Area at times of weddings or funerals.
 - f) For disabled persons Parking Places on the occasion on which the Sandbach Town Market takes place each Thursday as directed by temporary traffic signage.
 - g) a Vehicle waiting when the person in control of it is required by law to stop; is obliged to do so in order to avoid an accident; or is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control;
- 90) A police officer in uniform or Civil Enforcement Officer may suspend for not longer than twenty-four hours the use of a Parking Place or Parking Area or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
- 91) Any person or police officer suspending the use of a Parking Place or Parking Area or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of Article 89 or 90 to this Order shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that Parking Place or Parking Area or part thereof a traffic sign indicating that waiting by Vehicles is prohibited.
- 92) No person shall cause or permit a Vehicle to wait in a Parking Place or Parking Area or any part thereof during which such period as the Council or a police officer has suspended that Parking Place or Parking Area or part thereof and exhibits notice of such suspension, whether or not such notice is comprised within a traffic sign referred to within Article 91, on or near that Parking Place or Parking Area.
- 93) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, the Council may at its discretion issue a temporary Waiver Certificate allowing a specific Vehicle to Wait for a specified purpose in a road or a Parking Place or Parking Area during the hours of operation of any restriction or prohibition to the contrary, or a temporary suspension notice temporarily suspending any restriction imposed by this Order. The Council shall set a charge for the issue of such notices as it considers appropriate.

**PART VI
EXEMPTIONS**

- 94) Nothing in Part III of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle to wait in any of the roads, lengths of road or on the sides of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:
- a) Except for where Articles 31 and 32 apply, a person to board or alight from the Vehicle;

- b) the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:
 - i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths or sides of road; and
 - iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any line of telecommunication apparatus (as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984) kept installed for the purpose of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position;
- c) the Vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority, water undertaker, sewerage undertaker or the Environment Agency in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- d) Except for where Articles 31 and 32 apply, a marked Vehicle, whilst used by a Universal Service Provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, to deliver and/or collect postal packets;
- e) Except for where Articles 31 and 32 apply, the Vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths or sides of road;
- f) Except for where Articles 31 and 32 apply, the Vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths or sides of road for so long as may be necessary in connection with any funeral;
- g) the Vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes in the course of their dealing with an emergency; or
- h) a Vehicle waiting when the person in control of it is required by law to stop; is obliged to do so in order to avoid an accident; or is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control;

95) Save in Articles 29 to 34, nothing in Part III of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Person's Vehicle, which displays in the Relevant Position a valid and legible Disabled Persons Badge and a Parking Disc on which the Driver or other person in charge of the Vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began, to wait in any Parking Place for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same Vehicle in the same length of road or on the same side of road on the same day).

96) Nothing in Articles 20 and 21 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle which lawfully displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Person's Badge to wait, without limitation in time, on the lengths of road and sides of roads referred to in that Article.

**PART VII
CONTRAVENTION OF ORDER**

Contravention

97) If a Vehicle is left in a Parking Place or Parking Area during the Permitted hours or in any road or length of road in contravention or without complying with the requirements of this Order a contravention shall have occurred and a Penalty Charge shall be payable. A Penalty Charge Notice may then be issued.

Penalty Charge Notice

98) In the case of a Vehicle in respect of which a Penalty Charge is payable, it shall be the duty of

- a) a Civil Enforcement Officer to serve a Penalty Charge Notice in accordance with The 2022 Regulations; or
- b) the Enforcement Authority to serve a Penalty Charge Notice in accordance with The 2022 Regulations.

Manner of Payment of Penalty Charge

99) The Owner of the Vehicle shall pay the Penalty Charge as indicated on the Penalty Charge Notice to the Enforcement Authority or its Agent.

Indications as evidence

100) The particulars given in the Penalty Charge Notice served in accordance with Article 99 shall be treated as evidence in any proceedings relating to failure to pay such a Penalty Charge.

Restriction on removal of notices

101) A Penalty Charge Notice attached to a Vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 99 and The 2022 Regulations shall not be removed or interfered with except by or under the authority of the Owner or person in charge of the Vehicle or by some other person duly authorised by the Enforcement Authority.

**PART VIII
REVOCATION**

102) Without prejudice to the validity of anything done, or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into effect of this Order, the Orders specified in Schedule 1 and any Amendment Orders to those Orders are hereby revoked.

STATEMENT OF REASONS

Effect

The effect of the proposed Order will be to revoke all the existing all prohibition and restriction of waiting, loading, stopping and street parking places in Cheshire East and then re-enact the provisions of those Orders into one consolidated Order for waiting, loading, stopping and street parking places in Cheshire East.

Reasons

Currently details for all static traffic restrictions such as the prohibition and restriction of waiting, loading and street parking places throughout the Cheshire East area are stored as paper copies. Under current legislation, Cheshire East Council not only has an obligation to introduce static traffic restrictions in order to ensure the safe and efficient movement of road users on its highway network, but it should also ensure that its Traffic Regulation Orders (TRO's) are systematically reviewed and maintained so that they conform to current legislation.

With the advancement of digital and online technology, this system of record keeping has become outdated and due to the large quantity of TRO's which have been made over a number of years, it can also be time consuming to locate relevant orders which are either current or have at some point been superseded.

In view of these difficulties, the decision has recently been taken to produce a new TRO for static traffic restrictions on the Cheshire East road network, which will effectively consolidate all existing restrictions as one new TRO. This process will provide the foundations for creating a base TRO which can be placed on a computer software programme, specially developed for creating map-based information for current and proposed restrictions, along with details of previous restrictions which have subsequently been replaced or removed. It should be noted that there are no proposed changes to current restrictions in this new TRO, it is just a consolidation of existing restrictions which are already in place on the road network.

Having access to TRO information through this map-based system will also provide the addition benefit of enabling members of the public and the police and enforcement team to access up-to-date information, via the internet, on all existing and proposed restrictions.

In summary this Traffic Regulation Order is proposed to improve and provide access to up-to-date information on moving traffic restrictions on the Cheshire East road network by recording details of all approved TRO's on a computer software programme, specially developed for creating map-based records of current and proposed restrictions.
